

## Charles Almer

HACKETTSTOWN — Charles W. Almer, 78, died yesterday at Hackettstown Community Hospital after a long illness.

Born in Townsbury, he was a graduate of Hackettstown High School and Churchman Business College, Eastern, Pa.

Mr. Almer was a member of the Vienna Methodist Church, and Oxford Lodge 127, F&AM, where he had served twice as past master. He was also a member of the Scottish Rite, and the Crescent Temple Shrine, Trenton.

He was vice president of the Pequest Union Cemetery Association and had served for 29 years as its superintendant and treasurer.

He was a founding member of the Independent Township Volunteer Fire Co., serving as the company's first fire chief and later as its president.
