George Baier

HACKETTSTOWN — George C. Baier, 87, formerly of Knowlton Township, died Monday, Aug. 11, in Hackettstown Community Hospital.

Born March 2, 1910, in Newark, he was a son of the late Jacob and Katherine Baier. He resided in Knowlton Township from 1954 to 1995, when he moved to Hackettstown.

He was former owner and operator of Oraton Rubber Stamp Co. in Knowlton Township.

He was a former member and treasurer from 1955-56 of the Paulinskill Watershed Commission. In 1959 he was appointed to the Knowlton Township Planning Board and served until 1961. He was elected in 1961 to the Knowlton Township Committee and was mayor in 1963.

He was a past member of the Rotary Club in Blairstown and served as its president from 1966-67. He was past member and president of the Irvington Optimist Club, Marking Device Association, Lehigh Valley Printing House Craftsman, Knowlton Township School Board and also

one of the founders and first presidents of the former Knowlton Township Chamber of Commerce.

He and his wife, the former Isabelle Mills, were married 64 years.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Isabelle of Knowlton Township; four grandchildren; and 11 great grandchildren.

Two sons died earlier, Robert in 1957 and George in 1970.

Services were held at Newbaker Funeral Home, Blairstown. Burial was in Cedar Ridge Cemetery, Blairstown.
