

**RAYMOND BARTRON**

**TUCKERTON** — Raymond Bartron, 56 Ensign Drive, and formerly of Hackettstown, died Wednesday at Southern Ocean County Hospital in Stafford after a short illness. He was 74.

Born Aug. 19, 1899, in Hackettstown, Mr. Bartron was a son of the late James and Jenny Hoffman Bartron. He lived most of his life here until 1951, when he moved to Belvidere. He spent 11 years there before moving to Tuckerton 7½ years ago. He retired as a leather worker in 1966 from the Lackawanna Leather Company.

A U.S. Army Signal Corps veteran of World War II, Mr. Bartron was a member of the American Legion Blue Ridge Post No. 164, a life member of the Cataract Hose Company in Hackettstown and the Exempt Firemen's Association in Hackettstown.

Survivors are his widow, Mrs. Clara Mikkelsen Bartron; and a niece, Mrs. Betty Wildrick of Hackettstown.

Services will be conducted tomorrow at 2 p.m. at the Metzler-Scala Memorial in Hackettstown by the Rev. Bruce Wills of the Belvidere Methodist Church. Interment will be at Pequest Union Cemetery in Great Meadows.
