

### Clyde Beatty

Services were held Friday in the Smith-McCracken Funeral Home, Newton, for Clyde Beatty, 71, of Newton, who died March 19 at Newton Memorial Hospital.

Born in Hackettstown, he had resided there for many years before moving to Newton in 1972.

He was a self-employed painter and a member of Morristown Local 307 Painters, Paperhangers and Decorators Union.

A Navy veteran of World War II, he was a member of the Hackettstown American Legion. He was also a charter member of the Hackettstown Elks, and from 1972 to 1976, was a steward at the Newton Elks Club.

A charter member of the Hackettstown Eagles Semi-Pro Football Association, Mr. Beatty was a charter member of the Warren County Midget Football program, the first midget football league in the state, which was established in 1946. He was also a player on the Hackettstown state championship football teams of 1930, 1931 and 1932.

Mr. Beatty was the Musconetcong Country Club's golf club champion of A-Flight in 1951, 1953 and 1954. He was also past president of the Basketball Official's Association of Warren County.

Surviving are a son, Larry of Newton; three sisters, Dorothy Bruun of Budd Lake, Irene Shirey of Miami, Fla., and Geraldine Andrey of Lan-

sdale, Pa.; four brothers, Paul of Miami, Malcolm of Snellville, Ga., Willis of Hackettstown and Dr. Ralph of Indiana, and three grandchildren.
