Brief Illness Proved Fatal To Warren Beaty Monday Morning.

Death came to Warren Beaty early this week at his home on East avenue, and the report Monday that he had been stricken was received with profound regret by a large circle of personal friends, business associates and others. It was not generally known that Mr. Beaty was critically ill and therefore the announcement of his death came with a greater surprise and with a deeper degree of sorrow. It was more than a score of years ago that Mr. Beaty came to Hackettstown, having purchased of John P. Hoffman the flour and feed mill property on East avenue, which he was still operating at the time of his death, assisted by his son. Henry Beaty.

Foreseveral months Mr. Beaty had not enjoyed his usual health, but an illness some three or four weeks before his death brought about throat complications of an erysipelas attack of a malignant nature and a confinement to his room and later to his bed followed.

For several years soon after becoming a resident here. Mr. Beaty gave much of his time to the service of the community as a member of the Common Council, serving as its president with the strict confidence of his fellow associates. He was also vitally interested in the work and success of the Hackettstown Board of Trade, serving both as its president and secretary. The interests of the Musconetcong Mill Owners Association also demanded his attention and service and he gave of his counsel in the demands sought for property protection.

Mr. Beaty's surviving immediate members of his household are his wife, three sons, Enos, Lehman and Henry Beaty and one daughter, Miss Mildred Beaty. To them the sympathy of the community is sincerely extended.

The funeral services of Mr. Beaty were held at two o'clock yesterday afternoon at the East avenue home and were conducted by Rev. Dr. James W. Martyn, pastor of the local Presbyterian Church. Interment—was in the family plot in Union Cemetery. He was a member of Musconetcong Lodge, No. 81, 1, 0, O. F. His age was fifty-seven.
