 Funeral services were held Wednesday for John William Bellis, 61, of 108 West Prospect Ave., who died Sunday at Hackettstown Community Hospital after a long illness.

Born in Ringoes, he lived here since 1939. He was a retired soil conservationist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture at its Morristown office for 20 years.

He formerly owned and operated a dairy farm in Hunterdon County and served as a farm manager for the Agricultural Experimental Station of Rutgers University for five years.

A member of the International Oddfellows, Lodge 72 Ringoes and the Ringoes Grange, he also belonged to the Soil Conservation Service of America and the National Association of Federal Employees. He was a member of the Wm. Larison's Corner Presbyterian Church, Ringoes.

He is survived by his wife Evelyn E., a son John W. Jr., Huntington, N.Y.; a daughter, Mrs. Carlyn A. Barr, Lake Tranquility; a brother Ernest G. of Ringoes, and five grandchildren.

Services were at the Cochran Funeral Homes, Hackettstown. Interment was in Amwell Ridge Cemetery, Ringoes.
