He was known to many people in the Hackettstown area for his work in bringing the native bluebird back to New Jersey, building and distributing hundreds of bluebird houses. In 1983, he received the John and Norah Lane Award for Outstanding Contribution to Bluebird Conservation by an Individual, from the North American Bluebird Society.

He was also well known as a peace activist and a proponent of
