Michael B. Bowers

HACKETTSTOWN—Michael B. Bowers, 76, died Monday night at his home in Willow Grove street. He had been ill several weeks and recently underwent an operation at Somerset Hospital, Somerville. Mr. Bowers was the senior member of M. B. Bowers & Son, a foundry and farm machinery business established many years ago by his father, the late Robert Q. Bowers. The elder Mr. Bowers was one of a group of men which donated land on which Centenary Collegiate Institute was built.

Michael Bowers was charter members of the Hackettstown Club, founded in 1907. Honorary pall-bearers will be from the club's charter membership list.

Mr. Bowers is survived by his wife, a son, Wilbur F. Bowers, who was associated with his father in business; two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Stitzer and Mrs. Frank Gulick of Philadelphia, and a brother Robert Q. Bowers Jr. of Easton, Pa.

Funeral services will be held at the home tomorrow at 3 P. M. Interment will be in Union Cemetery. Rev. H. R. Breisch, pastor of Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church will officiate.
