WM. A. BOWERS.

It is with deepest sadness that we chronicle the demise of Mr. Wm. A. Bowers, youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. R. Q. Bowers, who died on Sunday last at 12 o'clock, M., at the age of 21 years and two months. The deceased up to September last, had been agent for the firm of Stitzer & Son, tobaccoists, of Philadelphia, when he entered a copartnership with John J. Haney, and opened a tobacco and cigar factory at Camden, this State, and had gained a thriving trade.

About three weeks ago he complained of feeling unwell, and consulted a Camden physician, who advised him to come home. After arriving home he was taken seriously ill with typhoid pneumonia, from which he suffered terribly, and was conscious up to Thursday last, when he became unconscious, remaining so until death relieved him of his suffering.

He was a young man of intelligence, refinement and great business ability, a friend to all with whom he became acquainted. His funeral took place from his father's residence, on Willow Grove street, on Wednesday at 10 o'clock, A. M., Rev. C. E. Little, former pastor of the M. E. church, conducting the services in a solemn and impressive manner. Rev. J. A. Munroe, present pastor of the M. E. church, and Rev. Dr. Whitney, of the Institute, also made a few remarks.
