

Alfred Brown died last evening at 10 o'clock at his home on Church street, from general debility, after an illness of several months. Mr. Brown has been in active business here for more than a quarter of a century, conducting the manufacture of clothing and muslin underwear. He was within a few weeks of 75 years old. Funeral services will be held on Monday.

## Death of Alfred Brown

As announced last week, Alfred Brown died at his home on church street last Thursday evening at 10 o'clock from general debility, after an illness of several months.

Mr. Brown was born in Sussex county June 19th, 1826. He was the son of John and Mary Brown, and has three sisters and one brother still living. In 1850 he married Miss Sarah Alpaugh, who survives him, together with three daughters and one son: Mrs. C. J. Reese, Mrs. F. E. Little and E. E. Brown, of this place; and Mrs. G. M. Thus, of Newark.

Thirty-five years ago he came to Hackettstown and engaged in the manufacture of clothing; later he engaged extensively in the manufacture of muslin underwear, in which business he was very successful. At one time he had factories located at Stanhope, Washington and Hackettstown. A few years ago his factory at Stanhope was destroyed by fire and was never rebuilt. The factories at the two latter places are still in operation.

Funeral services were held at his late residence on Monday afternoon, Rev. M. D. Church, assisted by Rev. E. C. Little, officiating. Business places were closed during the hour of service. Interment in the family plot in Union cemetery.

The members of the family desire to thank the friends and neighbours who so kindly assisted them in their late bereavement.

The deceased's will was read Monday afternoon. He leaves everything to his widow, who for the present will continue his business.
