Royal H. Brown, 104, of Hackettstown, died July 4 at Hackettstown Community Hospital.

Born in Newark, he lived in Maplewood before moving to Hackettstown in 1980.

He was the owner of the J.H.W. Climax Co., a manufacturer of locks for jails, railroads and pipelines in Newark from 1924 to 1969.
