### Mrs. Sarah Alpaugh Brown.

The last of the three sudden deaths that occurred in Town within the forty-eight hours ending Monday night, was that of Mrs. Sarah Brown, widow of the late Alfred Brown. The particular sadness in this case was the fact that there was absolutely nothing in her condition to indicate an early dissolution. On Monday morning Mrs. Brown, accompanied by her daughter, Mrs. Charles J. Reese, walked to the house of the late J. Seward Linsdon to be present at the funeral service. The walk was but a short distance and when she took her seat among the sorrowing friends there was no indication that the short walk had tired her or that she was suffering any inconvenience. She was stricken just before the services began and carried unconscious from the room, placed in one of the carriages and driven to her home. She lingered in an unconscious condition until 11 o'clock at night, when death put an end to the hopes of a sadly stricken family circle.

Mrs. Brown was 75 years of age. She was a daughter of Peter and Mary Alpaugh, and was born in Hunterdon
