

John Bulkeley,
Navy vice admiral 4/6/96

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) — John Bulkeley, a retired Navy vice admiral and a recipient of the Medal of Honor for his heroism in the Pacific during World War II, died Saturday at his home in suburban Silver Spring, Md. He was 84.

Bulkeley was a patrol torpedo (PT) boat commander in World War II who was known for breaking through Japanese lines for the transportation of Gen. Douglas MacArthur and his staff from Corregidor to Bataan to Mindinao in the Philippines.

For his service over a four-month period in defense of the Philippines, Bulkeley was awarded the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest military decoration.
