She was predeceased by her six siblings, Caroline Mooney, Matthew Mooney, Mary Mooney, Agnes Mooney, Margaret Mooney Zanks, and Anne Kappler. Also preceding her in death were her two sons, Billy, in 1949, and Terence, in 2011.
