Philip D. Carosella

Philip D. Carosella, 83, of Hackettstown, died at home on March 5 after a long illness.

Born in Niagra Falls, N.Y., he was the son of the late Alexander and Clotilda Carosella. He lived in Kearny and moved to Hackettstown 1975.

Mr. Carosella retired in 1975 as the owner of the Garden State Barber Supply Co., Jersey City.
