

OBITUARY

Mr. Henry Carpenter, for many years a resident of this place, and well known throughout this community, died very suddenly at half past one o'clock on Friday last, about four miles from Albany, N. Y., where he was employed as a section boss, under Ford Bros., the railroad contractors. He had eaten a hearty dinner at noon, apparently as well as ever and was directing the working of the men under his charge when without a word of warning he fell to the ground and expired. Heart disease, from which he had been a sufferer, was the cause. A telegram was received by friends here the same afternoon informing them of his death, and Undertaker King was dispatched at once to Albany for the remains. They arrived on Monday and funeral services were held at the residence of his son, on High street, in the afternoon, conducted by Rev. Burr of the Methodist Church. Deceased was fifty-seven years of age,
