## P. M. CHAMBERLAIN DIES CHRISTMAS DAY

Long Illness Ends Rather Suddenly
At His Home in Netcong.

Pierson Miller Chamberlain, of the firm of Shields-Chamberlain Company of this place, died at five o'clock Christmas afternoon at his home in Netcong. For several years he had been a sufferer from a chronic ailment of the heart and arteries, and for several months past had been unable to leave his home. Christmas morning he was suddenly stricken and it was apparent that he could not sarvive many hours.

Mr. Chamberlain married Miss Lillian Yawger, danguter of the late Phillip Yawger, of Chester, who survives him with one daughter, Limna Chamberlain, twelve years old, Had he lived until next February he would have reached his sixty-third birthday. The early life of Mr. Chamberlain was spent at Chester. where for a number of years he profitably conducted a jewelry business. Later he opened a coal and lamber business in Netcong, which he sold to the Druke Basteda Company, and entered the jewelry husiness in Netcong. In 1907 be because a member of the arm of shields Chamberlain Company and until falling health prevented much of his personal attention was given to the success of the business, to which his death is a material loss. He was nerive in Democratic politics in Moeris County and was a State delegate to the St. Louis Convention which nominated Wood row Wilson for president!

In fraternal organizations he was active for many years, especially in the Masonic order, being a past master of the Jodge at Chester. He was a member of the board of directors of the Hackettsiown Mutual Fire Insurance Company. His church relations were with the Stanhope Presbyterian Church. Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at his home in Netcong Burial will be in the Hackettstown Union Cometery.
