That Charles Burton Clawson had had been stricken from a heart attack and death resulted in a few hours was the sudden news sent out from his home Tuesday morning shortly before noontime. But few knew that he had been ill at his home on Moore Street for the past two or three days, and the report of his death came with much surprise to his business associates and acquaintances.

For several years past he had taken up contract building and several jobs of construction work now remain uncompleted. He was a mechanic of recognized ability and one whose word was considered as good as his bond. In the death of Burt Clawson the building interests of Hackettstown has sustained a decided loss. He was trained in the old school of carpentering, an inheritance from his father, Lewis Clawson, of Grand Avenue. father, mother and wife, he is survived by a sister and two brothers, all local residents.

Funeral services will be held at two o'clock this afternoon at the rooms of Mr. Cochran, and will be conducted by Mr. Neff, pastor of Trinity Methodist Church. Burial in the family plot in Union Cemetery. He was fifty-one years old.
