FRANK W. COLE

The body of Frank W. Cole of 40 Stockman Place, West Orange, a retired railroader, was brought here Tuesday for interment in Hackettstown Union Cemetery. Services were conducted in the morning at the Cole Funeral Home, Newark.

Mr. Cole, a former resident here for many years, died on Saturday, January 21, 1956, at Orange Memorial Hospital after a short illness. He was born 84 years ago in Dover and came to Hackettstown as a young man. Employed by the Delaware Lackawanna Railroad for 40 years, he still worked as an assistant conductor at his retirement five years ago.

He was the father of two sons, of which one survives, William of Connecticut. He also leaves one brother, William Cole of High Street; two sisters, Mrs. Emma Valentine of Washington Street and Mrs. Nellie Luff of Monroe Street; four grandchildren and four great grandchildren. His wife, the former Luella Lawrence, died five years ago.

Mr. Cole was a member of Newark Lodge No. 750, Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen.
