Orpha I. Danley, 89, of Hackettstown died Monday, Aug. 13, in Hackettstown Community Hospital.

She was head nurse at Centenary College in Hackettstown, retiring in the early 1980s. Before that, she was a registered nurse at Jersey City Medical Center for many years. She also was a community home nurse. She, along with her husband, was owner and operator of the Former Danley's Diner in Hackettstown until 1975.

Born May 31, 1912, in Vienna, N.J., she was a daughter of the late Philip and Lillian Sergeant Quick. She resided in Hackettstown and Vienna all her life.

She was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church in Hackettstown.

She was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, former Independence Chapter No. 102 in Hackettstown.

Her husband, Howard C., died in 1977.
