

OBITUARY

We learn from the Daily Independent that Mr. Joseph C. Day who for a few weeks past has been stopping with his brother-in-law, Mr. E. M. Fleming, of Belvidere, died quite suddenly on Wednesday, of consumption. He had his supper as usual and retired. During the night he called some of the members of the family and complained of feeling cold. He was made comfortable. After a while he called again, and upon going to his room he was found to be dying. A physician was sent for, but when he arrived the unfortunate man was beyond aid. He passed away peacefully. His age was about 52 years. He was a brother of A. R. Day, Esq., of Hackettstown. He came to Belvidere some two months ago from Florida, where he had gone for his health. He purposed going to Hackettstown in a few days.

The funeral services were held at the residence of E. M. Fleming, on Saturday morning at 11 A. M. His remains were brought to Hackettstown and interred in Union Cemetery.
