STATEN ISLAND, N.Y. -- Frances DiSalvo, 85, of Oakwood, retired seamstress, died Wednesday in the House of the Good Shepherd, Hackettstown, N.J.

Born Frances Nastasi in Brooklyn, she moved to Rosebank in 1946 and to Dongan Hills, her home for 35 years, in 1961. She lived in Oakwood and in Hackettstown before entering House of the Good Shepherd three months ago.

Mrs. DiSalvo was a seamstress at the Glenlock Manufacturing Company in Stapleton for 25 years. Afterwards she spent six years at Gasper LaFata & Co., a garment factory in Mariners

Harbor. She retired at age 61.

She was a volunteer for the Deborah Hospital Foundation. She enjoyed sewing and crocheting, bingo and traveling.

Mrs. DiSalvo was a parishioner of St. Charles R.C. Parish, Oakwood.

"She was devoted to her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren," said her daughter, Rosalie Murphy.

Her husband of 52 years, Benjamin, died in 1999.

In addition to her daughter, Rosalie, she is survived by a son, Steven; a daughter, Francine Proscia; two brothers, Peter and Paul Nastasi; a sister, Providence Place; six grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren.
