Worry Thought to Have Hastened End of Aged Woman.

Mrs. Nancy Batson Dow, widow of William Dow, died Monday from paralysis at her home in Main street, at the advance age of eighty-eight years. For a long time she had been confined to her home from the infirmities of old age.

Two weeks ago Wednesday her only son, Frank Dow, disappeared from home, and worry is thought to have hastened the end of his mother climaxed by a stroke of paralysis.
