### MISS AGNES EMMONS.

Miss Agnes Emmons, youngest sister of Mr. Joseph Emmons, of this place, and T. C. Emmons, of New York city, formerly a resident of this town, died at the residence of Mr. W. C. Cook, on Schooley's Mountain Sunday night. The deceased lived in this town her life time, up till about six years ago, when she went to Newark. Until about three months ago she had been in excellent health, but at that time her health began failing, when two of the ablest lung physicians of New York city were called, and pronounced her case an incurable one, and suggested a change of climate. She was sent to Schooley's Mountain where she was confined to her bed for nine weeks with consumption, suffering untold agonies of distress with Christian patience, realizing the fact that she must succumb to the disease by which she was afflicted. She was one of three sisters, all of whom died at about the same age, being 24 years old. She was a member of the Congregational church of Newark, and a lady of culture and refinement.

She leaves many friends beside her two brothers, to mourn her untimely departure. The funeral took place at the residence of Mr. Cook on Wednesday afternoon, being preached by Rev. Mr. Smith of Schooley's Mountain. The interment was in Union Cemetery, of this town.
