ROBERT N. ERRINGTON HACKETTSTOWN -

Graveside services were held Friday for Robert N. Errington, 81, of Countryside Lane, formerly of Great Meadows, who died May 25 at Dover General Hospital after a short illness.

Born April 2, 1895 in Orchard Park, N.Y., he was a son of the late William and Eva Errington. He had lived in the Hackettstown area for 40 years.

A retired attorney, he was a graduate of Princeton University, 1917, and St. Lawrence University Law School, Canton, N.Y., 1924. He was with the Wall Street law firm of Emmet, Marvin and Martin.

A retired Army Lieutenant Colonel, he served in both world wars and was the former commanding officer of New Jersey's 308th Field Artillery. In World War II he commanded the 751st Field Artillery Battalion.

Among the medals and honors he was awarded were the French Croix de Guerre and the American Defense Service Medal and the Bronze Star.

His sole survivor is his wife, the former Ann Colberg.
