ELIJAH EVERITT.

Elijah Everitt died at his home, on Moore street, in this place, on Tuesday noon, Sept-5th inst, after a long and severe illness, of nervous prestration.

Mr. Everitt was the son of David Everitt, and was been in Everithstown, Hunterdon county, Jan. 10, 1818. He removed to Caguga county, N. Y., near Union Springs when quite young, remaining there until about 29 years old, and learned his trade as mason and bricklayer. When about 21 he rode on horseback to Hackettstown; remaining here a short time, he went to Amboy and from thence to Gulf City, La., where he was engaged in railroad construction with his brother Abram for three years. Returning to Hackettstown he married and has lived here ever since, following his trade until ten years ago, when he gave up masoning, and has since devoted his attention to his practice as veterinary surgeon. He was well known for miles about as "Doctor," and his services were often required, He was of a humorous and kindly disposition, and had no enemies. He leaves a widow by second marriage, two sons, J. Milton and Alexander, and a daughter, Mrs. John Paul, of Newark, all children of his first wife, Funeral on Saturday at 1:30 P. M., in the Presbyterian church.
