OBITUARY

J. Milton Everitt died last Saturday evening from heart disease at his home on Sharp street. He had been ill for a year or more and had been confined to his home a month. He was 73 years old, and was a candidate on the Republican ticket for re-election to the Council for the sixth tune. He was born at the Everitt homestead on Moore Street opposite the town hall. He learned the harness making trade with the late William D. Metler, who was employed by the firm of W. L. and G. W. Johnson for a number of years. Later he engaged in the business for himself and continued until his death. For many years he was a veterinarian. He was president of Council and a member of the State Board of Health for two years.

Besides his wife he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. John C. Sharp, of this place, and two sons; William M. Everitt, of Brooklyn, and John P. Everitt, of this place; a sister, Mrs. Amelia Paul, who occupies the homestead on Moore Street, and a brother, Alexander Everitt, of Stewartsville. Funeral services were held at his late residence Wednesday afternoon. Dr. Martyn officiated. Burial in the family plot in Union Cemetery.
