

Mrs. Sarah A. Everitt.

Mrs. Sarah Ann Everitt, widow of J. Milton Everitt, aged seventy-nine years, passed away at her home at 318 Sharp street last Monday, Feb. 3. She had been suffering from septic poisoning for the past five weeks. Her maiden name was Miss Sarah A. Maxwell, and her home was at Clinton, up to the time of her marriage in 1872, when they made their home here. Her husband was engaged in the harness business up to the time of his death.

Mrs. Everitt was afflicted with spinal trouble and confined to her bed for the long term of twenty-seven years, but since 1905 she overcame it sufficiently to be able to walk with a cane and has been a partial invalid since. She is the mother of three children, William, John and Jennie, and is survived by one son, William M. Everitt of Westfield, one daughter, Mrs. John C. Sharp of High street, and four grandchildren, William M. Everitt of Westfield, J. Paul Sharp of St. Louis, Mo., and Janet and Milton Everitt of Sharp street.

The funeral services were held at her late home Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. James W. Martyn, pastor of the Presbyterian Church, officiated, assisted by Rev. John S. Burton, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Interment was in Union Cemetery.
