

Walter W. Ferrier

COPLAY, Pa. — Walter W. Ferrier, of Coplay, Pa., formerly of Hackettstown, died Monday, Feb. 13, 2006 in Whitehall Manor, Whitehall, Pa., after a long illness. He was 76.

Born March 24, 1929 in Rosyth, Scotland, he was a son of the late George Ferrier and Rose Windle.

He came to the U.S. in 1957 with his family aboard the Queen Elizabeth II and resided for most of his lifetime in Hackettstown. For the past year-and-a-half he lived in Coplay, Pa.

He was a retired self-employed window display man and in later years restored antiques. He served in the British Royal Air Force.

Ferrier was a member of Church of the Covenant, Hackettstown, and served as a Ruling Elder in the church for many years.

His wife, Elspeth, died on September 27, 1994.

He is survived by a son, W. Muir Ferrier of Georgia; a daughter, Fiona Eskow of Coplay, Pa.; a sister, Margaret MacKenzie of Australia; a brother, Tommy Ferrier of Scotland; seven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Interment was in Hackettstown Union Cemetery. Arrangements were handled by the Scala Memorial Home, Hackettstown.
