## WILEY A. GIFFORD

NEW YORK — Wiley A. Gifford, formerly of Hackettstown, died Aug. 10 at Flushing Hospital in Flushing, N.Y., after a long illness. He was 60.

He was born July 3, 1932, in Queens, N.Y., to James and Emma Fowler Gifford. He lived in Queens most of his life, then moved to Hackettstown for 13 years before returning to Queens in 1991.

Mr. Gifford retired in 1977 after 23 years a New York City police detective and worked for seven years for the Warren County Probation Department as a probation officer.

He was a Navy veteran of the Korean War.

He was a member of the Joyce Kilmer Knights of Columbus 2483 in Hackettstown and played third base for the Knights of Columbus baseball team for many years. He was also a member of the American Legion of Whitestone, Queens.

Survivors include his wife, Nine (nee Burdett); three sons, James and Shawn, both of Hackettstown, and Wiley of Erie, Pa.; a brother, Charles of Whitestone, Queens; four sisters, Eileen Gentile, Dorothy Tallauer and Ann Gifford, all of Whitestone, Queens, and Roberta Schroeder of Long Island, N.Y.; and five grandchildren.
