

## DEATH OF ARETAS HALL

**Connected With Local Industrial Interests For Many Years.**

Aretas Hall, chief engineer at the American Saw Mill Machinery Company's plant in Hackettstown, died at his home in lower Washington street, about eight o'clock Wednesday morning, from congestion of the brain, after an illness of several days' duration.

Mr. Hall was fifty years of age and he was born in Vienna, the son of Benjamin and Susan Bartron Hall. He was married in 1888 to Miss Lillie Hueber, of Vienna. With his father, Mr. Hall conducted a bending mill in Hackettstown a number of years ago, on the site of the office of the Saw Mill Machinery Company's plant. He was an employee of the Saw Mill Machinery Works for the past fourteen years. He was prominent in the order of the Knights of the Golden Eagle, and had gone through all the chairs of that organization. He was a hard working man and his services were highly valued by his employers.

Besides his widow, Mr. Hall is survived by four sons and two daughters: Ivan, Elwin and Carl, at home; Lloyd, at Ledgewood; Vesta, at home, and Leila, wife of Howard Sutton of Hackettstown. The funeral will be held Saturday morning at ten thirty o'clock, from the late residence, Rev. J. W. Martyn officiating. The interment will be in the Union cemetery at Hackettstown.
