ARTHUR HANCE DIES SUDDENLY AT PENWELL

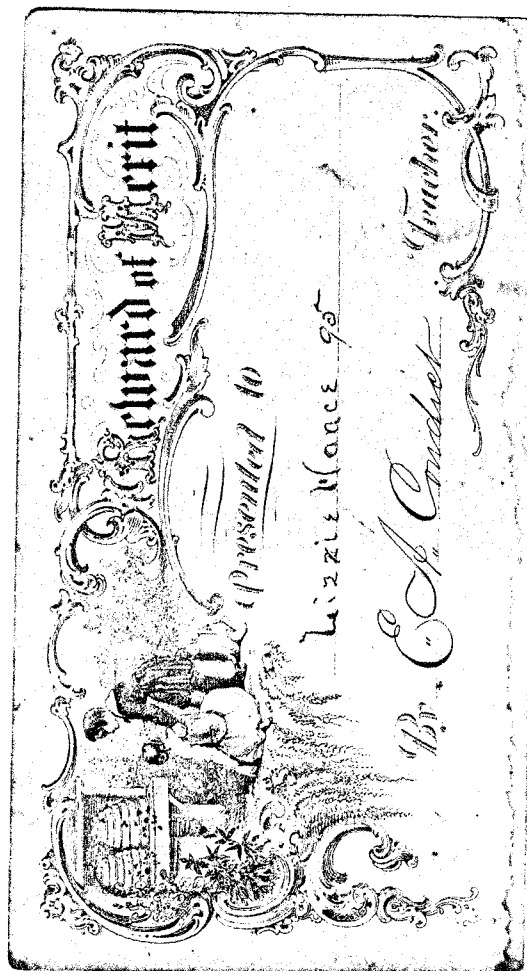
