## **OBITUARY**

Death of James M. Hance.

At three o'clock, Wednesday morning, one of the oldest and most respected citizens of Vienna possed peacefully away to his last home. James M. Hance. The deceased has suffered greatly for the past two years with asthma and was also troubled with heart disease. The fatal illness began a couple of weeks ago with an attack of the grip which soon took a serious turn. Mr. Hance was born near Beatystown, on December 12, 1807, and lived there fortyeight years.
