Services were held for the Rev. Charles P. Harder, 91, of Hackettstown, who died July 9 at the House of the Good Shepherd of Hackettstown after a long illness. He was a retired minister of the United Methodist Church.

He was born in Philmont, N.Y. and attended Cornell University and Drew University. He was a member of the Drew University Alumni Association.

Most of Mr. Harder's ministry was in the New York Conference of the Mlethodist Church. Churches he served in New York State include Stone Ridge, Kenoza Lake, Grand Gorge, Highland Falls, Bloomsville, Greenville, Napanoch, Pine Plains, Pawling, Otisville and Woodycrest United Methodist Church in The Bronx. Before retiring in 1966, he was transferred to the Northern New Jersey Conference and was the pastor of the United Methodist Church in Milton.

Following his retirement, Mr. Harder and his wife resided in Saxton Falls, and he was the supply pastor of the United Methodist Church in Waterloo Village. Later he was minister of visitation at Trinity United Methodist Church, Hackettstown.
