

## Jacob C. Hart

Jacob C. Hart, 83, of Yarmouth Port, Mass., died July 31 at Hospice House in Barnstable, Mass.

He was born in Murray Hill and

lived in Hackettstown before moving to Natick, Mass., then in South Yarmouth, Mass., for 25 years and later to Yarmouth Port, Mass.

Mr. Hart was a Hackettstown High School graduate and a 1938 Northeastern University graduate. He was employed by Lever Brothers Co. as a clerk and later worked for the former Cape and Vinyard Electric Co. (now Comm

Electric) from 1950 until his retirement in 1974 as a paymaster.

He served in the U.S. Marine Corps in the South Pacific during World War II.

Mr. Hart was active in Little

League baseball and Babe Ruth League baseball in Yarmouth Port, Mass. He was a founding father of the DY Boosters Club, instrumental in the running of the Pop Warner Football program and helped initiate the DY Hockey program, both in Yarmouth Port, Mass.

His hobbies included bird breeding, fishing and bowling.

Mr. Hart is survived by his long-time companion, Blanche Malley; three sons, Peter of Naples, Fla., Charles and Jeffery both of Yarmouth Port, Mass.; twin sisters, Miriam Ritzer and Muriel LePre, both of Hackettstown; seven grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

Graveside services were held the Massachusetts National Cemetery in Bourne, Mass.
