Kenneth Hart

Kenneth Hart, 85, formerly of Hackettstown, died Dec. 1 at his home in Altamonte Springs, Fla., after a long illness.

Mr. Hart had been the captain of the 1925 Hackettstown grid team.

Born in Murray Hill, Mr. Hart was the son of the late Arminius and Mary Glover Hart. He grew up in Hackettstown and lived in Metu-

chen before moving to central Florida in 1950.

Mr. Hart was the captain of the 1925 Hackettstown High School football squad that had the only undefeated, unscored upon season in the school's history. He was the first in a long line of Harts who played football for the Tigers.

A graduate of Hackettstown High School, Mr. Hart was also a graduate of the Bliss Electric School in Washington, D.C. He had worked for New Jersey Bell Telephone Company, Elizabeth, and then for the Keller Music Company, Orlando, Fla., until his retirement in 1972.

He was a World War II veteran, having served in the 320th Signal Company in Rheims, France. He was awarded the European African Middle East Campaign medal and two Bronze Service Stars for service in Normandy and in the Rhineland.

Mr. Hart is survived by his wife, Theresa; four sons, Larry of Sandwich, Mass., Donald of Virginia Beach, Va., Bernard of Sanford, Fla., and Bruce of Lawrenceville, Ga.; a daughter, Melanie Baggs of Enterprise, Fla.; a brother, Jacob of South Dennis, Mass.; two sisters, Miriam Ritzer and Muriel Lepere, both of Hackettstown; six grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Memorial services were held on Dec. 5 at Woodlawn Memorial Park, Orlando, Fla. Arrangements were by the Woodlawn Funeral Home, Orlando, Fla.
