Lewis Hayward, Retired Assessor In Hackettstown



Funeral services for Lewis B. "Scrubby" Hayward, former Hackettstown tax assessor, who died Sunday at his home, 323 Washington St., were held Wednesday afternoon in the Cochran

Funeral home. Mr. Hayward was 90 years old.

Masonic rites were held Tuesday night at the funeral home. Mr. Hayward was honored as a 50-year member in 1966 by Independence Lodge No. 42, F. and A. M., Hackettstown.

Mr. Hayward served as Hackettstown assessor for 42, years - from 1914 until 1956 when he retired. He was formerly employed as a retail food store manager.

Born November 13, 1877, in Hackettstown, he was a son of the late Edwin and Elizabeth Batson Hayward, and a life-long resident of Hackettstown.

He was a member of Trinity Methodist Church, Independence Lodge and Hackettstown Exempt Firemen's Association, all Hackettstown, and a life member of Cataract Hose Co. No. 1, Hackettstown.

His wife, the former Mary Norgard, died in 1963.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Harrison Weighill, Hackettstown, and two sisters, Mrs. Edna Tunstead, Indianapolis, Ind., and Mrs. Ernest Lowell, Norristown, PA.
