

L. Milton Hibler ex-councilman in Hackettstown

HACKETTSTOWN — L. Milton Hibler, a former town council member, died yesterday at Newton Memorial Hospital after a short illness. He was 78.

He was born in Newark and lived most of his life in Hackettstown.

Mr. Hibler, who was a member of the council from 1943-69, was self-employed as president of the Williams & Hibler Lumber Yard, Hackettstown, until the time of his death.

He was a member and trustee of the Trinity United Methodist Church, Hackettstown, and a member of the Independence Masonic Lodge 42. He was a former member of the Hackettstown Municipal Utilities Authority and a charter member of Cataract Hose Company 1, Hackettstown.

He was a 1932 graduate of Pennsylvania State University and a member of its Sigma Nu fraternity.

Survivors include his wife, Marjorie; two sons, Andrew and William, both of Hackettstown; a daughter, Joan Roehrich, School-eyes Mountain; 10 grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.
