Death of G.A. Howdl.

Gustavus A. Howell, youngest son of the late Isaac B. Howell, died at the home of his motherin-law, Mrs. J. A. Rice, in lower Washington Street, at 7 o'clock last Thursday night, after only ten days' illness from heart trouble, preceded by an attack of pneumonia. Mr. Howell had an attack of grip and without fully recovering returned to his work. He spent part of a day fishing and caught cold, which, developed into pneumonia. This in connection with his weak heart resulted in death. It is indeed a sad case. His wife was recently taken to the Memorial Hospital at Morristown for an operation of a very serious nature. The operation has been performed and she is slowly recovering but the physicians in charge did not think it advisable or did her condition warrant her coming home to attend her husband's funeral.

Mr. Howell was thirty-eight years old and had spent most of his life here. He is survived by a widow and three small children - two girls and a boy. Also an aged mother, three brothers - Robert, of Binghamton; Thomas B. and Charles, of Hackettstown; Mrs. H. W. Mutchler, of Rockaway; Mrs. John Hess, of Phillipsburg; Mrs. William McCracken, of Morristown and Mrs. J. B. Roe, of Passaic. He was a member of Musconetcong Lodge. I. O. O. F., and Pequest Tribe, Improved O. R. M.

Funeral services were held at St. James' Episcopal Church Monday afternoon. The church was crowded to its utmost capacity by relatives and friends who assembled to pay their respects to the departed. Interment in the family plot in Union Cemetery.
