

Duane W. Hull, 62, of Catawba, N.C., formerly of Hackettstown, died Jan. 5 at the Winston-Salem Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem, N.C.

Hull was a carpenter for the Hercules Powder Corp. of Rockaway Township, before retiring in 1983.

Hull, the son of the late Alvin and Gladys Hunt Hull, was born Feb. 25, 1926, in Livingston. He lived in Catawba for the past year, moving from Hackettstown, where he had lived for 26 years.

Hull served in the Army during the Korean War. He was a member of the Hackettstown First Presbyterian Church, Independence Lodge 42 F&AM of Hackettstown, the Scottish Rite Lodge of Trenton, and the Tall Cedars of Lebanon Forest 14 of Phillipsburg, and the Eastern Star Chapter 102 in Hackettstown.

He and his wife, Anna Whitmore Hull, celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary on Sept. 25, 1988.

Surviving, in addition to his wife, are a daughter, Diane R. Hull of Hackettstown; a brother, Ward F. Hull of Vienna; and four sisters, Muriel Pfeifer of Bridgewater, Alvene Andrews of Tuckertown, Marjorie Fowler of Lawrenceville, Ga., and Mary Gilmer of Lithonia, Ga.

Interment was at the Tranquility Cemetary in Tranquility. Funeral arrangements were done by the Cochran Funeral Home in Hackettstown. Eastern Star and Masonic services were conducted at the funeral home.
