

RAYMOND C. JOHNSON

A service was held yesterday morning at the Cochran Funeral Home for Raymond C. Johnson, 67, of 102 Fourth Street, Hackettstown, a veteran of World War I. A Requiem Mass followed at St. Mary's Church with the Rev. Joseph P. Sergel as the celebrant.

A lifelong resident of the Hackettstown area, Mr. Johnson died on Saturday, May 19, 1962, after a long illness at the Veterans Hospital, East Orange, where he was confined two months.

Born in Beattystown on July 3, 1894, he was a son of the late Ezra and Eva Robertson Johnson. He was a self employed electrician and at one time operated an appliance store on Main Street as well as a storm window business.

He was a member of Blue Ridge Post No. 164, American Legion, the Exempt Firemen's Association and was a life member of Cataract Hose Company No. 1, all of Hackettstown. He was a member of St. Mary's Church.

Surviving are his wife, the former Alice Riedinger; two sons, Richard of Beattystown and Robert of Washington; a daughter, Mrs. Richard Williamson of Hackettstown; a sister, Mrs. May Straub of Hackettstown, and four grand children.

The Legion and firemen conducted services Tuesday night at the funeral home. Interment was in Hackettstown Union Cemetery.
