

PROF. KLUPPELBERG DEAD.

Frederick William Kluppelberg died at his home on Grand avenue, at ten o'clock last evening, of hemorrhage of the bladder. His final illness was of little more than a week's duration, and Dr. Martin has been in charge with Dr. Hubulacker, of Easton, in frequent consultation. The end was foreshadowed early in the evening when he began sinking into a comatose state.

Prof. Kluppelberg was one of the most respected men in our local social and business community, and his death will occasion profound regret. He came to Hackettstown in 1866 from Seelscheid, a Rhinish province of Russia, where he taught school. His wife, deceased some years ago, was a sister of the first Mrs. T. G. Plate, and that relationship was largely instrumental in locating them in Hackettstown. His claims to the regard of his fellowcitizens was his industry, his upright character, his aggressive public spirit and his broad sympathies. He began his business here in a small way and saw it grow into one of the leading commercial enterprises of its kind in this part of the State. He celebrated his 75th birthday two weeks ago. He is survived by his son William, his daughter Louisa, and two grandchildren. The funeral services will be held at his late home on Monday.
