



LEONARD KOENIG

PHILADELPHIA, PA. — Funeral services for Leonard Koenig, a Hackettstown businessman for more than two decades, were held here Aug. 28.

Mr. Koenig, 67, died of cancer at Lankenau Hospital, Philadelphia, on Aug. 26. He was stricken in June while visiting his daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Levine of 3 Stanley Place, Budd Lake, and had been hospitalized 12 weeks.

Mr. Koenig was the founder of Leonard's Youth Togs, 118 Main St., Hackettstown, but he was even more widely known in the Hackettstown area for his fine sense of humor. A master of repartee, his joy in life was derived from giving others a lift with a laugh.

He was born in Philadelphia Jan. 11, 1910, the son of the late Isadore and Bessie Koenig.

Mr. Koenig and his wife, the former Ruth Seidel, lived in Hackettstown and operated their children's clothing store from 1950 to 1971, when they moved to Hallandale, Fla. The business is continued by Mr. and Mrs. Levine.

Surviving in addition to his wife and daughter are a son, Gerald, of Livingston, and six grandchildren.

Burial was in Har-Zion Cemetery, Philadelphia.
