

## **Irvin Kraft owned Hackettstown store**

Funeral services were held Tuesday in the Cochran Funeral Home, Hackettstown, for Irvin W. Kraft, 66, of 511 Monroe St., Hackettstown, who died April 15 at his home.

Mr. Kraft had been a partner in the Kraft Paint Company, Hackettstown, for 39 years.

Born in Belleville, he was a life member of the Hackettstown Rescue Squad and a founding member and trustee of Hackettstown Community Hospital. He received the Hackettstown Chamber of Commerce Volunteer Award in 1979.

He was a member of Independence Lodge 42, F&AM, Hackettstown; Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of
