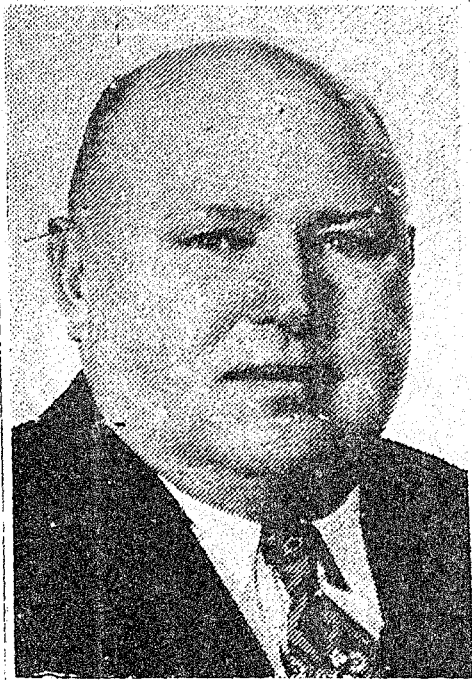


OBITUARY

Expires At 57



GEORGE KRUMM

57, of Mountain Avenue, Hackettstown, local wholesale beverage distributor, died last Thursday night, November 8, 1951, in the Warren Hospital, Phillipsburg, after a long illness.

Mr. Krumm was born in Austria and settled in 1918 at Chester, Pa., where he was a restaurateur. He also had restaurants in Allentown prior to moving to Washington in 1933, when he first established a wholesale beverage distributorship.

He was a member of the Washington B.P.O.E., Washington Loyal Order of Moose, of which he was a past governor; Holy Name Society of the Church of the Assumption in Hackettstown, and various local rod and gun clubs.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Julia Krumm; three sons, Myron of Plainfield and Thomas and Stephen of Hackettstown; five grandchildren; a brother, Stephen of Easton, and two sisters in New York City.

Brief services were held Sunday night at his late home by the Elks lodge. Solemn requiem high mass was celebrated on Monday at 10 a. m. in St. Mary's Church by the Rev. Marko Gill, rector of St. Nicholas Church, Great Meadows and the Rev. Andrew Rudakewych, former pastor of St. Nicholas Church. Interment was in Hackettstown Union Cemetery.
