WASHINGTON TWP. (Morris) — Joseph Clayton Kuhn, a Boy Scout leader and former fire chief, died Monday at Hackettstown Community Hospital after a long illness. He was 62.

He was born in Georgia. He moved to the Long Valley section of the township in 1963.

Mr. Kuhn was a technician for the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. in Netcong for the past 42 years.



He was a Merchant Marine veteran of World War II.

He was a former chief of the Schooleys Mountain Fire Department and a member of the Long Valley Juvenile Conference Committee.

Mr. Kuhn, who was involved in Scouting since age 7, was a member of the Catholic, Protestant and Jewish Committee for Scouting of the Boy Scouts of America; scoutmaster of Sussex District Troop 286; and a special scoutmaster for Pack 2331. He was a member of the Musconetcong Masonic Lodge, Netcong, and a past exalted ruler of the Hackettstown Elks.

Survivors include a sister, Juanita Brouwder, Atlanta, and a close friend, Helene Alexander, Doylestown, Pa.
