In the 1970s he was a Professional Stock Car Race Driver, racing in Flemington and Nazareth Speedways. His cars were "K9" and "Purple 21."

Survivors include his wife, Doris Y. Mooney Lemasters, a daughter, Barb Lemasters, of Great Meadows; two sons, N. Daniel Lemasters Jr. of Townsbury and Edward C. Lemasters of Great Meadows; two brothers, Raymond of Hackettstown and Carl of Evanston, Ill. and four grandsons.

He is predeceased by a brother, Ron Lemasters Sr., who died in 2000.
