

Community Leader**Mrs. F. A. Linaberry
Dies In Her 81st Year***(Margaret F.)*

Services were held Monday morning at the Cochran Funeral home in Hackettstown for Mrs. Margaret F. Linaberry of Route 46, Vienna, who was active in Woman's Club, church, civic and community affairs and was a former correspondent for The Gazette for many years.

A lifetime resident of the Vienna area, Mrs. Linaberry was born November 16, 1889, in Great Meadows, a daughter of the late John and Jennie DeHart Fisher.

She died in her 81st year at Warren Hospital, Phillipsburg, on Thursday, April 16, 1970, after a month's confinement.

Her husband, Floyd A. Linaberry died in 1967. They were married February 27, 1909.

She was a member of the Vienna Methodist Church, where she was organist for more than 30 years and also taught Sunday School, was a member of the W.S.C.S. and had been chairman of missions for the church. She was a charter member and past president of the Central School PTA.

A former president of the Woman's Club of Hackettstown and past vice president of the 10th District of the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Club, Mrs. Linaberry was cited by the Federation when her name was placed on the Honor Roll at the state convention in Atlantic City in June of 1958.

She was a 20-year member of the Board of Managers of the Warren County Chapter of the American Cancer Society, and was cited for her service in March of 1967 when she was presented a silver platter at an anniversary dinner in Alpha. She was also a past president of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Inde-

pendence Township Fire Department.

In 1962 at the organizational meeting of the newly formed Council of United Church Women of Hackettstown and vicinity, Mrs. Linaberry was unanimously elected president and at the time of her death was Warren County representative to the council.

Surviving are a son, Clyde of Rahway; a daughter, Mrs. Doris Bartel of Scotch Plains; four grandchildren, and seven great-grandchildren.

Her pastor, Rev. Ray S. McDon, conducted the services, assisted by the Rev. August J. King of the First Presbyterian Church of Hackettstown. Interment was in Pequest Union Cemetery, Great Meadows.

The auxiliary of the fire department conducted services Sunday evening at the funeral home.
