

Mrs. Gladys Lintner

BRANCHVILLE — Gladys Lintner, active in several area Methodist churches, died Sunday at Methodist Manor, here, after a long illness. She was 89.

Born in Arcadia, Kansas, she moved here in 1962.

She was the wife of the late Rev. Robert C. Lintner who died in 1960. Together they had served various churches in eastern Kansas and in the Northern New Jersey Conference of the Methodist Church, including ones in Bernardsville, Denville and Hackettstown.

Before her marriage, she gradu-

ated with honors from Baker University, Baldwin, Kansas, and taught school in Kansas. She also had taught German at Graham High School.

She served as industrial extension secretary of the Flint, Mich. YMCA during World War I and counseled and coordinated a recreation program for women and girls in office and factory work.

Mrs. Lintner was a life member of the United Methodist Women, serving at the local and conference levels. She served one term as vice president of the Jersey City District, Women's Society of Christian Service. She was also a member of American Association of University Women, Bloomfield, and the Ministers' Wives Association, Northern New Jersey Conference, United Methodist Church.

She was a member of the Asbury United Methodist Church in Paterson.

During a visit to Germany in 1950, Mrs. Lintner was inspired by the rehabilitation work of the Church World Service and various

denominational operations in Munich and Frankfurt. Both she and her husband, together with the United Methodist Church Organization for Refugees, were directly responsible for locating sponsors and employment for 2 families of displaced persons whom they had met in European refugee camps.

Surviving are a son, Robert D. Clifton; a daughter, Virginia Schmeal, Budd Lake; a grandson and a great-granddaughter.

Services will be private.
