

F. W. MacClellan Dies At Age Of 63

Services were held Monday afternoon at the Cochran Funeral Home for Frederick W. MacClellan, 63, operator of automobile agencies in Hackettstown for 40 years and former member of the local board of education. He resided at 501 East Prospect Street, where he was stricken fatally with a heart attack last Thursday afternoon, August 31, 1961.

Born in Hackettstown on February 21, 1898, he was a son of the late Dr. William MacClellan, a dentist, and Louise Osmun MacClellan. Engaged all his life in the automotive trade, Mr. MacClellan recently

discontinued his Chrysler-Plymouth agency at his building on East Moore Street, where his son, Jay, and George Johnson are continuing the garage business. A few weeks ago he had joined the Knechel Ford business on Main and Valentine Streets to handle the bookkeeping, accounting and parts.

He was a member of Trinity Methodist Church, Independence Lodge No. 42, F.&A.M., of which he was a past master, and Blue Ridge Post No. 164, American Legion. Mr. MacClellan was director of the Hackettstown Building and Loan Association and has served on the board of education for 10 years. He was treasurer of the Central Jersey Chrysler Dealers Association. He was a veteran of World War I and a member of the Exempt Firemen's Association of New Jersey.

Survivors are his wife, the former Laura Dickson, and a son Jay, of Hackettstown, and three grandchildren.

The Rev. John E. Griffith officiated at the services. Burial was in Hackettstown Union Cemetery.
